President's Report

Kogarah Historical Society now has a membership of 116. Attendance at our regular monthly meetings at Kogarah School of Arts on the second Thursday of the month at 2pm is about 25 to 35 members. Attendance on Australia Day at the Museum was down and so were the donations. Cath & Leo, Beverley Earnshaw & Gill Whan, Betty Goodger & Janette Hollebone were on duty, and Jan Magrath, new member, turned up to help. For the year we had an increase in attendance: 578 adults and 132 children, a total of 710 visitors through the Museum. There were 17 group visits plus the bus trip from Kogarah Library. In April Gill and I (Janette) had 32 children aged from 5 to 12 year olds. Gill took the children who could not read and we both showed our groups games children used to play. We had intended taking them on a walk but it rained heavily so we played games for 2 hours. It was great, but exhausting.

We charge \$2 for an adult and 50 cents for children to visit the Museum on Sunday afternoons when we open Carss Cottage from 1pm to 5pm. We increased the cost in 2013 for tour groups when we open up specially for them from \$3 per head to \$4. Carers, bus drivers and guides are free. Tours for school children remain at \$1 per head.

Marjorie Pritchard needs to be congratulated on keeping the Museum so clean for **12 years**. Congratulations, Marjorie. There is also a big thank you to Rosemary Maughan who volunteered to research the names on the Carlton Honour Board. A big task.

There were three working bees at Carss Cottage, two for the stocktake and one for the local theatre display. These were well attended by Janette, Gill, Beverley, Lawrie Corry, David Martin, Cath and Leo, Deirdre & Graeme Schroeder and the two Betties. Beverley had photocopied and laminated the photographic display. Stocktake will continue through 2013.

In January 2013, we opened the Museum on Wednesdays from 10am to 1pm, and were very happy with the number who visited. Our Volunteers were Irene and Warren Selmon who spent three Wednesdays on duty, and Mavis and Jan Magrath (Jan's first time) on one as well as our two Betties, Goodger & Reynolds. If we have the Volunteers next year we will do it again. We can always do with more Volunteers for duty at the Museum on Sundays (except public holidays) from 1pm to 5pm so please let Elizabeth Emerson or Gill Whan know if you are available.
